SUMMER STUDIES FOURTH & FIFTH GRADE

PHCA assigns Reading/Math Summer Studies in order to keep our student's minds active and ready to return to school on July 27, 2016. Please read carefully as to what concepts your child should have mastered and what assignments are due. Written assignments are **due July 27th to no later than Friday, July 29th** and will count towards first quarter grades in Language and Bible. Students will be assessed on mastery of Math items listed according to their grade level within the first weeks of school. In addition to the assigned reading, students may use commentaries or other resources to gain better understanding and hopefully a deeper appreciation for the gift of God's Word.

◆ Reading: Read the **Book of Joshua**

1. Make a list of 5 words that were new to you (with the chapter and verse where the word was used). Look up and record definition that applies to the verse being read. Use lined notebook paper.

Example: **Meditate (1:8): think deeply or carefully about.**

2. On another sheet of lined paper, write a three paragraph report on Joshua. In the first paragraph explain who Joshua is and any problems he faced. In the second paragraph write how he reacted to/what he did to solve his problem and how God gets involved. In the third paragraph write what you liked most about Joshua and how you can face a problem you might have like Joshua did.

Use your own words and avoid copying the verses exactly from the Bible. Each paragraph should have at least five (5) sentences.

- ### ◆ Math: Mastery of fundamental operations of addition/subtraction, practice and master multiplication/division tables up to the 12's. Be able to give answers within 5 seconds. Know place values to the thousands. Know two and three digit multiplication and checking division problems with two-digit divisors. Be familiar with adding and subtracting fractions with same denominator, adding and subtracting mixed numbers, and reducing fractions to lowest terms. Be familiar with English & Metric measures.

◆ Reading: Read the **Book of Proverbs**

1. Make a list of 10 words that were new to you (with chapter and verse where the word was used). Look up and record definition that applies to the verse being read. Use lined notebook paper.

Example: **Perceive (1:2): come to realize or understand.**

2. On another sheet of lined paper, write three separate paragraphs on Proverbs 3:5-8, the "Fear of the Lord", and "a foolish person". First Paragraph: Explain what these verses 3:5-8 mean and how you can apply them in your own life. Second Paragraph: Describe what the "fear of the Lord" is and how you benefit from it. Third Paragraph: Describe a "fool" and what you can do instead to be "wise".

Use your own words and avoid copying the verses exactly from the Bible. Each paragraph should have at least five (5) sentences and be based upon at least four (4) different verses. List verse references for each paragraph on the back of your paper.

- ### ◆ Math: Mastery of items listed under 4th Grade Math. Know place values up to the millions. Express remainders in division as fractions. Know adding and subtracting fractions with uncommon denominators, subtracting fractions with borrowing, changing improper fractions and multiplying with fractions. Know how to add and subtract decimals. Know English & Metric measures and how to convert measurements. Be familiar with converting fractions to decimals.
